INTERMEDIATE ENGLISH COURSE

Level B1 of the CEFR



10 sessions of 1h30 per semester

Prerequisites:

Having validated levels A1 and A2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

<u>General</u> Objectives :

- Expand vocabulary by working on advanced vocabulary and specific lexical fields.
- Strengthen the basics of English grammar and practice more complex structures.
- Gain fluency in both spoken and written English.
- Develop knowledge of the history and culture of Englishspeaking countries

<u>Learning</u> Objectives:

- Be able to master the syntax of simple sentences and certain complex structures.
- Use basic vocabulary and enrich it regularly.
- **Reading comprehension:** be able to understand written texts using daily language (mainly journalistic).
- Written expression: be able to write a coherent text on familiar and creative topics; be able to describe one's experiences and impressions.
- **Listening comprehension:** be able to understand the key information from radio or TV broadcasts, and grasp the essential content of a film or TV series.
- **Oral expression:** be able to take part in a conversation with clear pronunciation, comment on current events, and give one's opinion in a simple but reasoned manner.

Teaching Approach:

- Active teaching methods based on real-life situations.
- Listening comprehension practice (audio and video materials) in the language lab.
- Role-playing and written exercises: pair work, individual or pair writing assignments.

Teaching Materials:

Provided by the teacher: audiovisual materials, excerpts from books from various publishers, grammar exercises, glossaries

Assessment:

Test including grammar, vocabulary, and expression questions will be administered to students to assess their progres
