

KOREAN LANGUAGE COURSE – BEGINNER LEVEL CEFR Level A1



11 two-hour
sessions per
semester

Prerequisites: None (Be open to
Korean culture and other Asian
cultures)

General objectives:

- Develop students' curiosity to learn more about a rapidly growing country.
- Prepare students to interact with a major North-East Asian nation.
- Expose them to a new, rich and interesting culture.
- Offer them the opportunity to learn the basics of a language that is still rarely taught in French secondary schools.

Learning objectives:

- Learn to make yourself understood in everyday situations in Korea
- Express yourself using a vocabulary of approximately 800 words.
- Know the main registers of language - informal and formal

Teaching methods:

- First level of A1.1 (in reference to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages)
- The historical presentation of HANGEUL (Korean alphabet)
- Learning vowels and consonants
- Introduce yourself and say hello
- Ask someone for their identity, ask for and give your nationality
- Asking someone's opinion, expressing possession/non-possession
- Order a drink, say what you are doing
- Asking someone's opinion, ordering food, expressing existence or absence
- Asking and saying where you are going, describing a day, expressing habits
- Asking for and giving information, asking the price of something
- Talking about past events, asking about and indicating means of transport

Teaching materials:

- Work on textbooks for learning Korean: *Apprenons le coréen 1*
- *Cours de coréen 1*
- Work on the PPT adapted to the students' levels.
- Focus on oral communication
- Training through role-playing and immersion

Level assessment:

The four skills (CO, EO, CE, EE) will be assessed.
