BEGINNER LEVEL CEFR Level A1



10 sessions of 1.5 hours per semester

Prerequisites: None

General objectives:

This course will provide you with a basic knowledge of the Italian language. You will read short texts at an elementary level and learn to express yourself, both in writing and orally, in simple, concrete situations of everyday life. You will be able to introduce yourself (age, nationality, profession, studies), ask for information, order in a restaurant or book a hotel room.

<u>Learning</u> <u>objectives:</u>

• Audio recordings and short video clips will be used to practise listening comprehension and pronunciation. The dialogues studied will allow you to tackle the following grammatical concepts through exercises: articles, nouns, adjectives, interrogative words, prepositions, verbs in the present tense and the past tense. By the end of the second semester, you will have reached level A1 (basic user, discovery level) of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).

Teaching methods:

• The title of the textbook will be announced during the first class.

Level assessment:

A final test will allow you to assess your progress in relation to the course's learning objectives.
