

JAPANESE LANGUAGE COURSE: CONSOLIDATION LEVEL CEFR Level B1



11 two-hour
sessions per
semester

Prerequisite: Validation of CERCL level A2

General objectives:

- Continue to explore the Japanese language and culture.
- Develop communication skills in a variety of everyday and academic situations.
- Consolidate the basics of Japanese writing and pronunciation.
- Understand and produce simple but structured discourse, both orally and in writing.

Learning objectives:

- Strengthen oral and written comprehension through authentic materials.
- Being able to recount an experience, give your opinion, and express a feeling.
- Know how to use complex verb forms (conditional forms, honorific forms, etc.).

Teaching methods:

- Progressive learning of new vocabulary words.
- Acquisition of new Kanji (writing exercises and discovery of the meanings and uses of characters).
- Oral and written exercises to apply lexical and grammatical knowledge.
- Listening to a conversation to try to understand it.
- Introduction of new grammatical structures through concrete examples and role-playing exercises.

At the end of the course, students will have acquired:

- Learning new simple Kanji.
- Master intermediate grammatical structures (conditional, causative, honorific forms, etc.).
- Be able to express opinions and feelings clearly.
- Know how to greet people, introduce yourself and explain things in sufficient detail.
- Develop the ability to understand intermediate-level written documents (short texts, simple articles, etc.).

Teaching materials:

The course will be based on : *Minna no Nihongo Shokyû 2 Honsatsu*, Tokyo : 3A Corporation, 2014 (seconde édition).

This Japanese textbook and related volumes (translation and grammar notes, kanji book) are available for consultation in the language library. Photocopies of the textbook, and possibly other materials, will be distributed in class.

Level assessment:

The four skills (CO, EO, CE, EE) will be assessed.
